Each year, the senior respiratory care students participate in several service projects in the community, which consist of teaching at the high schools, assisting in health fairs, and other projects that promote healthy living in the community. This fall, one of the proposed class projects was to raise money to support the Special Olympics. This Friday, December 6, at 7:00 p.m., several students from the health sciences programs will participate in the Special Olympics' "Polar Plunge" during the 30th Annual Downtown Great Falls Association Christmas Stroll.

As part of this event, the respiratory care students felt that if they were going to freeze their tails off, they shouldn't do it alone. Brian Jensen, a senior respiratory care student, visited with several other health science programs in the school including dental, nursing, radiology, nutrition, EMS, surgical technology, and medical assistants to encourage participation.
